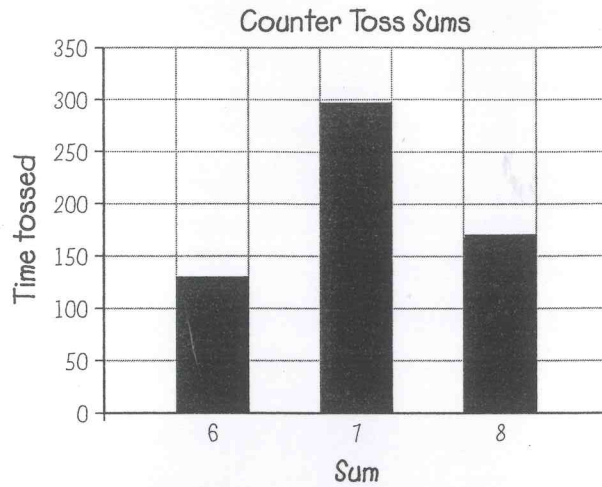

→ A. 6, 7, and 8

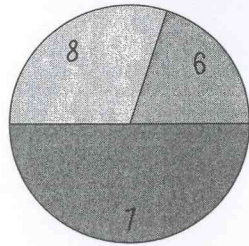
→ B. 7
